## <u>Literacy & Numeracy</u>

As part of Elk Island Public Schools' (EIPS) ongoing efforts to enhance the literacy and numeracy of students in all grade levels, FSE is once again administering the STAR 360 assessment to all learners in grade 1 to 6 and the Math Intervention/Programming Instrument (MIPI) assessment tools for students in grade 2 to 6 for in the 2020-21 school year. This is optional for grade 2 and 3 students as another Math assessment tool is being used for these grades. These assessment tools focus on literacy and numeracy, are digitally based and offer an opportunity for students to demonstrate their learning. The goal: To provide timely information to teachers, help enhance classroom instruction and ensure student learning needs are identified.

At three points throughout the year, EIPS students in grades 1 through 12 will complete the STAR 360 assessment, which evaluates reading comprehension. The assessment takes approximately 20 minutes and is administered on a digital device. At least once throughout the year, students in grades 2 through 10 will complete the MIPI assessment, which is a mathematical screening tool used to inform teachers about a student's math skills. For students in grades 2 through 6 it takes approximately 20 minutes. (\*Again, this is optional for grade 2 and 3 this year.) The results offer the teacher a clearer picture of a student's learning needs and help determine if subsequent instructional planning is required.

The scores of the assessments are <u>not</u> used toward a student's grade, and there is no need to study ahead of time. The tools simply provide the teacher with information to better understand where each student is in terms of reading

comprehension and mathematical ability. If, after analyzing the results, it's determined a student can benefit from extra support, the teacher will contact the family to discuss possible support strategies.

- ensure the safety of all students, drivers and property; and

The recordings assist the department with monitoring student and driver conduct and may be used as evidence in a disciplinary matter. ## Mask Tips

Students should bring multiple masks with them daily. Students will be encouraged to change masks when they become dirty, wet or torn. In colder weather masks can easily become wet from breathing. A wet mask is harder to breathe through and is less efficient at preventing respiratory droplets from reaching others. If a reusable mask becomes wet, It should be put in a sealed

bag until it can be washed and a clean, dry mask should be put on. Masks should have at least three layers of fabric and fit properly—not too loose or too tight. Reusable masks should be washed daily. Neck gaiters, bandanas and masks with one-way valves are not suitable masks.
