Dear FSE Families,

If you have not yet had a chance to read them, report cards are still available through the PowerSchool Parent Portal!

Last week, our calming strategies included 'Hot Chocolate Breath' and 'Affirmation Tapping'. This week we learned 'Lower Body Contract and Stretch' and 'Lotus Flower Breath'.

Lower Body Contract and Stretch: First, curl your toes as tight as you can for five seconds. Then release. Repeat this five times. Then roll your ankles to stretch. Next, stand up. Rise up on your toes, as tall as you can, and hold yourself there for five seconds. Then release. Repeat this five times. Then sit down and shake out your legs to stretch. Finally, stand up. Squat into a chair pose and hold for three seconds. Then stand up tall. Repeat this five times. Then stretch each leg out by pulling it behind you and holding for five seconds.

Lotus Flower Breath is: Place the fingertips of both hands together. With an inhale, pull your thumbs apart, then bring them together while you exhale. Go through each finger with the same inhale, pulling the pair of fingers apart and exhaling the fingers together. As you take one final breath, push the heels of your hands together and pull apart all of your fingertips as you exhale, as if you're opening a flower.

Your Child's Mental Health

Talk about emotions and feelings regularly. Kids learn so much by watching their parents, including behaviours when it comes to emotional expression and regulation. Rather than simply saying your day was good or okay, try to discuss different emotions you felt throughout your day when talking with your child. Talk to them about the moment you felt stressed in a meeting or frustrated with a coworker, and then talk to them about how you handled your emotions in that situation. This teaches them that these feelings are normal, provides suggestions on how to handle the feelings and gives them the vocabulary to talk about a wider range of emotions affecting them.

Tips to Help Your Child Enjoy Reading

Carve out family reading time. There's something powerful about sitting down together in the same room and reading. It could be a read aloud time or an independent reading time where everyone reads something different. Keep it light. And get comfortable.

Proposed collegiate school in Fort Saskatchewan

Dear Fort Saskatchewan families:

Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) is proposing to build a collegiate school to replace one junior high school and the senior high school in Fort Saskatchewan. The replacement school would support grades 7 to 12.

Located within Alberta's Industrial Heartland, the Elk Island Collegiate School would use existing partnerships and current industry leaders to provide students with the knowledge, skills and attitudes needed to respond to the changing landscape of the world of work. This model differs from current high schools within EIPS as, in addition to typical high school programming, it would also provide programming centred around seamless entry into the world of work or post-secondary education by providing students with industry-leading career and technology education and work-integrated learning experiences.

While EIPS is still in the early stages of the proposal process, the Division is looking for feedback from students, families, staff and the community to assist with planning. EIPS invites students, parents and caregivers of students at all grade levels, staff members and interested community members to share their thoughts through the EIPS Collegiate School Proposal: Stakeholder Feedback survey.
